# **Date of Discovery:**

On April 2, 2012 we will see the release of the 1940 US Census Bureau data on slightly less than 132.2 million people. This data will be from all 48 states with Nevada having the fewest people at just over 110,000 and New York having the

most people with close to 13,500,000. (Note: Alaska and Hawaii were not States in 1940)

There is a Federal Law prohibiting release of census data for 72 years from the time it was taken. Shortly after the release date, <a href="https://www.Ancestry.com">www.Ancestry.com</a> will allow the entire 1940 census to be viewed free of charge through the year 2013.

Many of us will see data on ourselves and members of our immediate family. It is likely some of us will find errors in that data – errors resulting from misunderstandings by the census takers or errors in the data our own family supplied. There is not much we will be able to do about any found errors, for it is reported to be impossible to correct data errors made 72 years ago.
